Indian Point is a risk NYC can't afford.

Indian Point is over 40 years old and increasingly dangerous.

It is the most vulnerable nuclear plant to earthquakes.

- One mile from two fault lines.
- Built for a 6.0 -- but quakes ten times that size are possible.

Storms, floods, fire, terrorism, human error ... all can cause a meltdown.

Just 25 miles from NYC. Nearly the whole city is within 50 miles.

- We could never evacuate in time to protect people.
- There is no nuclear accident plan for NYC.

NYC is directly downwind of Indian Point.

- Many lives would be lost.
- Most or all of the city could be uninhabitable.
- Economic impacts would be devastating.

NYC doesn't need Indian Point.

Studies show it is feasible and affordable to close Indian Point.

- Clean, carbon-free energy sources can replace Indian Point.
- Solar power in NYC could generate 3 times Indian Point.
- Energy efficiency could replace 75% of Indian Point's electricity.

Indian Point stands in the way of a green energy future.

Converting to renewable energy would:

- Create thousands of jobs in NYC.
- Build new industries.
- Reduce electricity costs.
- Make NYC safer, healthier, and more secure.
