A BILL

To require the President to issue guidance on Federal response to a large-scale nuclear disaster.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Nuclear Disaster Pre-

5 paredness Act".

6 SEC. 2. GUIDANCE FOR RESPONSE TO A NUCLEAR DIS7 ASTER.

8 (a) ISSUANCE.—Not later than 180 days after the9 date of enactment of this Act, the President, in consulta-

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tion with the Secretary of Energy, the Secretary of De fense, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection
 Agency, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the Sec retary of Homeland Security, and the Administrator of the
 Federal Emergency Management Agency, shall issue guid ance on Federal response to nuclear disasters described
 in subsection (b).

8 (b) NUCLEAR DISASTERS DESCRIBED.—The guid9 ance issued pursuant to subsection (a) shall be with re10 spect to any nuclear disaster that—

(1) may be caused by a natural catastrophe, an
accident, or a terrorist or other attack;

13 (2) occurs initially at a nuclear power plant;14 and

(3) disperses radiation off the reactor site andinto the surrounding area.

17 (c) GUIDANCE.—The guidance issued pursuant to18 subsection (a) shall—

(1) designate the single Federal agency that is
responsible for coordinating the Federal Government's efforts in response to a nuclear disaster (in
this Act referred to as the "Coordinating Agency"),
including making a formal declaration that a nuclear
disaster exists;

1	(2) identify the circumstances under which a
2	formal declaration described in paragraph (1) will
3	occur;
4	(3) designate the single Federal agency that, in
5	response to a nuclear disaster, is responsible for rec-
6	ommending to the Coordinating Agency—
7	(A) the evacuation of the area within a 10-
8	mile radius from the nuclear power plant; or
9	(B) the evacuation of the area within a
10	larger radius from the nuclear power plant, but
11	not more than a radius of 50 miles;
12	(4) identify the circumstances under which a
13	recommendation described in paragraph (3) will be
14	made;
15	(5) designate the single Federal agency that is
16	responsible for developing plans for an evacuation
17	described in subparagraph (A) or (B) of paragraph
18	(3), educating the public regarding such an evacu-
19	ation, and conducting such an evacuation when di-
20	rected to do so by the Coordinating Agency;
21	(6) designate the single Federal agency that is
22	responsible for recommending to the Coordinating
23	Agency that evacuees may return following a nuclear
24	disaster;

1	(7) identify the circumstances under which a
2	recommendation described in paragraph (6) will be
3	made;
4	(8) identify what cleanup standards will apply
5	for a nuclear disaster;
6	(9) designate the single Federal agency that is
7	responsible for conducting cleanup of a nuclear dis-
8	aster when directed to do so by the Coordinating
9	Agency; and
10	(10) identify any other roles and responsibilities
11	of any Federal agency involved in the response effort
12	to a nuclear disaster.
